Top 5 things to do *before* classes start

#1	How to change your HawkID password	Your HawkID is your personal identification and is necessary to register for classes and access most online university services like email, ICON, and MyUI. If you forgot your HawkID or password, or want to change it, visit hawkid.uiowa.edu
#2	Set up Duo on your device	Two-Step Login with Duo Security is our multi-factor authentication service. To access your UI online data (email, grades, or billing info) you must enroll. This additional security step uses something you know (your HawkID and password) with something you have (your smartphone) to prove it's you. Enroll now at <u>its.uiowa.edu/duo-mobile</u>
#3	Connect to the right campus wireless signal	 There are three wireless networks on campus: 1. eduroam: Secure, high-speed wireless on campus, log in with your HawkID 2. UI-Guest: Do not use this network. It isn't secure and many services won't work while connected. It is intended for guests and short-term use 3. UI-DeviceNet: Designed for gaming consoles and streaming devices Connect to eduroam now: <u>its.uiowa.edu/student-wifi</u>
#4 	Download essential software	Microsoft Office 365 is free and provides access to email, calendar, and apps like Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Teams, and OneDrive for Business. Review the Microsoft apps and download up to 5 copies of Microsoft Office at <u>office365.uiowa.edu</u> Discover and download additional no-charge software at <u>its.uiowa.edu/student-software</u>
#5 	Update your computer or buy a new one	If you already own a computer, make sure it (and all software) is up to date. If you need to buy a new one, take advantage of education discounts and review our recommended specs. Review computer specs and discounts at <u>its.uiowa.edu/student-computers</u>
